II. WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?

Man has a natural desire to _____ and to ignore God's principles for living.

The Bible calls this attitude .

Sin breaks our close relationship with God. It causes us to fear God and try to live our lives outside of His will.

"But your iniquities have separated you from your God." Isaiah 59:2

"For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23

When our relationship to God is not right, it causes problems in every area of our lives – marriage, career, relationships, finances, etc. Usually when people have problems they try many different ways of coping with it before they finally turn to God.

Even when we know that our deepest need is God, we often try wrong ways of getting to know Him.

- "It doesn't matter what you believe just as long as you are sincere..."
- "I'll be religious and go to church..."

Baptism doesn't make you a believer – it shows that you already believe. Baptism does not "save" you, only your faith in Christ does that. Baptism is like a wedding ring – it's the outward symbol of the commitment you made in your heart.

At Oak Hill Baptist we wait until our children are old enough to believe and understand the true meaning of baptism before we baptize them. However, many parents do decide to "Dedicate" their children to the Lord. This is a ceremony that is a covenant between the parents and God on behalf of the child. The parents promise to raise their child in the faith until the child is old enough to make his own personal confession of Christ. This ceremony is Biblical and many examples of it can be found in the Bible.

At Oak Hill Baptist it is a membership requirement that every member must have been baptized the way Jesus demonstrated. Many hundreds of people have been baptized at Oak Hill in the history of the church.

V. WHEN SHOULD YOU BE BAPTIZED?

As soon as you have believed!

"Those who believed were baptized...that day!" Acts 2:41

"Then Philip began with the scripture and told him the Good News about Jesus. As they traveled along the road, they came to some water, and the man said, 'Look, here is water! Why shouldn't I be baptized right now?' Philip said, 'If you believe with all your heart, you may.' The man answered, 'I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.' So they went down into the water and Philip baptized him." Acts 8:35-38

There is no reason to delay. As soon as you have decided to receive Christ into your life, you can and should be baptized. If you wait until you are "perfect", you'll never feel good enough.

CAN A FAMILY BE BAPTIZED TOGETHER?

Yes! If each family member understands fully the meaning of baptism, and each one has personally placed his/her trust in Christ for salvation, we encourage families to be baptized at the same time. It is a wonderful expression of commitment. However it is important to remember that baptism is a personal statement of faith, not a family tradition. It is usually not wise to delay your baptism while waiting on other family members to accept Christ, particularly children. Doing so puts undue pressure on them and delays *your* obedience.

THE MEANING OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Jesus never asked His disciples to remember His birth but He did instruct them to remember His death and resurrection. He gave the church two visible symbols (called ordinances) as reminders of His death. These two ordinances are: Baptism and the Lord's Supper. The Lord's Supper is an object lesson that represents a great spiritual truth for believers.

I. WHAT IS THE LORD'S SUPPER? (1 Corinthians 11:23-26)

II. WHO SHOULD TAKE THE LORD'S SUPPER?
Only those who are already Mark 14:22-26
"For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgement upon himself." 2 Corinthians 11:29

III. HOW DO I PREPARE MYSELF FOR THE LORD'S SUPPER?

"Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. A person ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup." 1 Corinthians 11:27-28

IV. WHEN AND HOW OFTEN SHOULD WE OBSERVE THE LORD'S SUPPER?

Jesus never said when or how often believers should observe the Lord's Supper. He instituted it on a Thursday night. Since it is a 'supper', it may seem more appropriate to observe it at an evening service. However, there are no set rules dictating when or how often. Most churches, including Oak Hill Baptist, celebrate it in the Sunday morning service. However from time to time we also celebrate it on Sunday evenings, at the mid-week service, at banquets, in small group Bible studies, and one-on-one in hospitals and sick rooms.
